The children will understand features of non fiction texts about penguins and write their own factual page, contributing to a class information book.

We will be continuing our daily phonics sessions in Phase 5 and continuing with our precursive handwriting.

Geography- The children will learn about the north and south pole and the equator which divides the hemispheres. They will learn about the few animals which inhabit Antarctica and understand what a glacier is.

In RE this term the children will be looking at 'Meals' and 'Change' with a deep understanding of Easter.

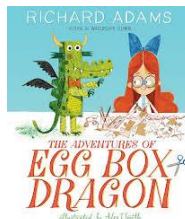
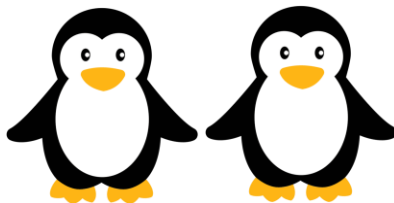
RSHE Keeping safe

Spring 2 YEAR 1 Topic: OUT OF AN EGG

Music- The children will be learning about the sound (timbre) that different instruments make. They will use the instruments to create sound effects related to their topic. They will sing a range of songs and use instruments to play along and accompany their singing.

Computing- The children will use Purple Mash to follow and create simple instructions on the computer and to understand how to debug a set of instructions (algorithm)

Science

The children will be learning to identify and name a variety of everyday materials, including wood, plastic, glass, metal, water and rock.

They will go on to describe the simple physical properties of a variety of everyday materials and sort them into different groups.

Mathematics

The children will be continuing to develop our understanding of place value within 50 and learning multiples of 2, 5 and 10. We will then focus our learning on measurement- looking at length and height and weight and volume. This will all be done through practical and fun learning activities. We will spend time this term on writing numbers correctly.

French- We will continue our weekly French lessons with Madame Chouati learning about numbers, fruits & vegetables, family names and simple conversation.

DT -The children will be designing, making and evaluating their own egg box dragon models.

Art- The children will be looking closely at the colours in an Antarctica landscape. They will be encouraged to mix colours to make different shades.
